

Troy is a Professor of Clinical and Forensic Psychology and a registered psychologist with expertise in assessing and responding to targeted violence (e.g., stalking, family violence, and grievance-fuelled violence). She focusses on translational research, creating new knowledge to inform practice, policy and service design. Through collaborations with justice and mental health agencies Troy's research, advice, and training has led to the development of practice frameworks and resources that demonstrably improve responses to targeted violence. In addition to her research and consultation work, Troy is a Principal Psychologist at the Victorian Institute of Forensic Mental Health (Forensicare) and Director of Swinburne University of Technology's postgraduate forensic psychology training degrees. She is a Past President of the Australian and New Zealand Association of Psychiatry, Psychology and Law, and sits on the editorial boards of the journals *Criminal Justice and Behavior*, *Journal of Family Violence*, and the *Journal of Threat Assessment and Management*.
